Westside Children's Center *(Culver & Centinela)*

This wonderful Center was featured in last year's April newsletter. Unfortunately our contact at WCC left soon thereafter so any of you who called her to express interest have been lost in the paperwork, so please contact Jill so she can get your name and info. to pass along.



WCC provides low cost, quality care to children from low income and poverty level homes whose parents are working or going to school. The Center serves 100 children daily ranging in age from 18 months to five years old and is open Monday through Friday. Volunteers can work in the child care center as teachers' aides. Responsibilities include reading to the children, being a mentor, helping with arts and crafts, meals, and circle time. Volunteer shifts are: 8:30 am – 12:30 pm and 3:00 pm – 5:30 pm. Some weekend and evening shifts are available. You must have a current TB test and background check to participate in this program.

Marina del Rey Hospital

Are you a people person? MdR hospital needs front desk volunteers. Main lobby or patient services desk (one is busy, the other is a quieter desk if you'd like a slower pace). Minimum commitment is a 4-hour shift one day a week. Free parking and meal voucher are offered to volunteers. They prefer a commitment of a year if possible. The hospital is at Lincoln & Mindanao.

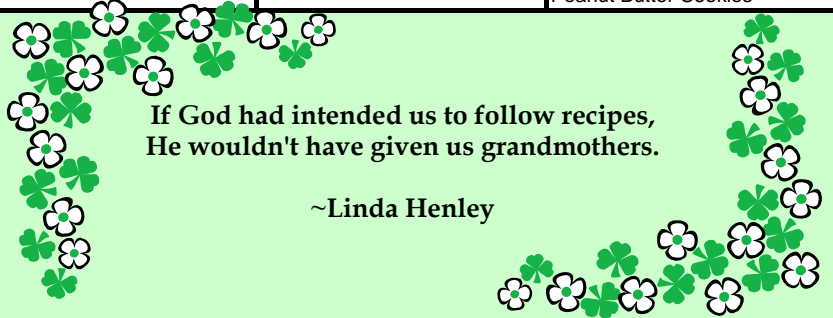

To reserve lunch, please call between 9 a.m. - 12 noon the day before. Please sign in for your lunch ticket before 11:15 a.m.

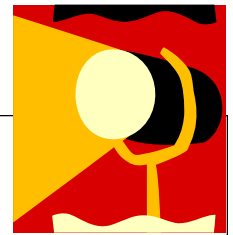

New Alzheimer's-Alert Program

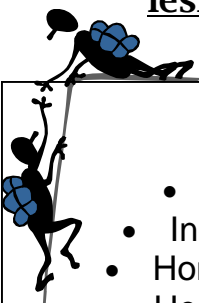
To improve the safety of those with Alzheimer's or related dementia, Medic-Alert & the Alzheimer's Association have formed an alliance to offer Medic-Alert + Alzheimer's Safe Return. This is a 24 hour emergency response service for individuals with dementia, who may wander and/or have a medical condition.

When an individual who is registered with this program becomes lost, his or her information + photo is provided to local law enforcement. When the individual is found, the 800 number on the product is called and the individual's family and/or caregiver is notified. The nearest Alzheimer's Association office provides information & support during the search.

In case of a natural disaster, or a personal emergency, first responders will be able to identify the individual with dementia. The same occurs if the individual registered has a medical emergency. To enroll someone in Medic Alert + Safe Return, contact the Alzheimer's Association at 1-800-272-3900 or Medic Alert at 1-888-577-8566.
