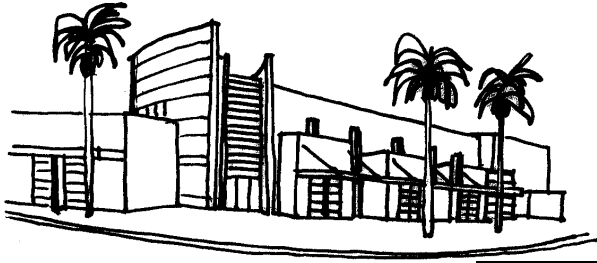

The program is designed to teach young schoolchildren about the last remaining major coastal salt marsh in L.A. County. Field trips for students take place Tuesday & Thursday mornings, usually 3-5th graders. Docents lead the children on an interpretive nature walk that last approximately two hours.

Docents (trained volunteer teacher or guide): You should be willing and able to work with a group of approximately 12-15 children, accompanied by a teacher or parent. Some docents prefer our outreach program, visiting schools with a slide show.

Notes: Training and program occurs outdoors and involves a lot of walking – always come prepared with water, hat, sunscreen and wear comfortable walking shoes.

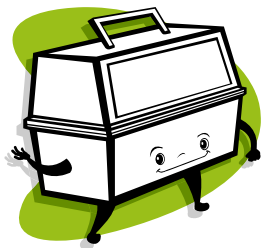


PROJECT CHICKEN SOUP

Basic Program Information:

- ◆ All potential participants will be reviewed and approved by staff
- ◆ Once approved, vans provide curb to curb service from 8:30 a.m. to 4:10 p.m., Monday – Friday within Culver City limits, as well as Kaiser Cadillac.
- ◆ Door-to-door van service is available upon request
- ◆ Suggested donation of \$0.50 each way. For your convenience, a \$10 prepaid Dial-A-Ride card can be purchased at the Senior Center Business Desk, 7-Days a week.

TAXI COUPON PROGRAM

Culver City Residents

- ◆ Culver City residents of all ages are eligible
- ◆ Proof of residency
- ◆ Participants must have a Physician Authorization Form on file completed by their doctor verifying that the applicant cannot drive or ride a public bus due to illness or disability
- ◆ All potential participants will be reviewed and approved by staff

County Residents within View Park, Windsor Hills, or Ladera Heights

- ◆ Proof of residency
- ◆ County residents under 60 years of age must submit a completed Physician Authorization Form verifying that the applicant cannot drive or ride a public bus due to illness or disability
- ◆ Residents over 60 years old do not require doctor verification

General Information

- ◆ Coupons are available for purchase 7-Days a week
- ◆ Each book costs \$2.00 and represents \$10.00 worth of coupons to be applied toward taxi fare
- ◆ Registered participants can purchase 5 books per month — Coupons Never Expire!
- ◆ Taxi drivers are required to accept a maximum of \$8.00 in taxi coupons per trip, the remaining balance of the fare shall be paid by the rider. Tips for taxi drivers are the responsibility of the rider
- ◆ Taxi wait time is 15-30 minutes on most calls, depending on traffic conditions
