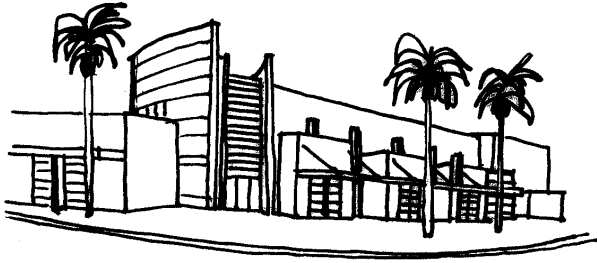

Beatrice served in many roles, first as a teacher and then as a school administrator in charge of the Special Education curriculum. Other responsibilities included acting as coordinator of the National Lunch program, Community Relations Program and serving on the County Safety Committee.

Volunteering became a way of life for Beatrice, starting in 1972, when she first volunteered for Voter Registration, a passion that was ignited because she was unable to vote in her native state of Alabama. This passion endures to this day. Beatrice carries voter registration forms with her wherever she goes!

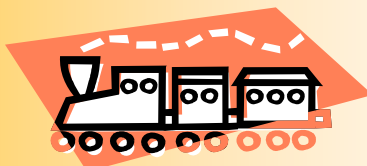
TRIP REMINDERS

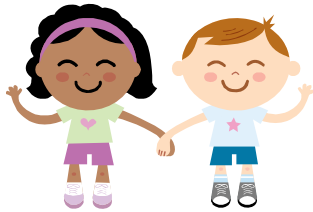

Power Lunch Reading Volunteers

Everybody Wins! offers one-on-one reading experiences with elementary school students and caring adults. Students share lunch, conversation and literature with volunteers for one hour a week. Program is at El Rincon Elementary at 11177 Overland this spring – just 5 minutes from the Senior Center. You must have a current TB test and background check to participate. Just one hour a week can make SUCH an impact on a child's life!



Westside Children's Center (*Culver & Centinela*)

WCC provides low cost, quality care to children from low income and poverty level homes whose parents are working or going to school. The Center serves 100 children daily ranging in age from 18 months to five years old and is open Monday through Friday. Volunteers can work in the child care center as teachers' aides. Responsibilities include reading to the children, being a mentor, helping with arts and crafts, meals, and circle time. Volunteer shifts are: 8:30 am – 12:30 pm and 3:00 pm – 5:30 pm. Some weekend and evening shifts are available. You must have a current TB test and background check to participate in this program.

Upward Bound House (*Washington & Beethoven*)

This new Emergency Family Shelter is serving transitional families who are formerly homeless and staying at the shelter for 90 day periods. Volunteers are needed for late lunch/dinner services for the families staying at the shelter.

Volunteers would ideally work a full shift from 4:30-7:30 p.m., but they could also also split the shift and work 4:30-6 or 6-7:30 p.m. First shift will set up and serve food and second shift will serve, clean dishes and set up for breakfast.

They would prefer a weekly commitment (i.e. someone that would work every Tuesday night) and the service is needed Monday through Friday.



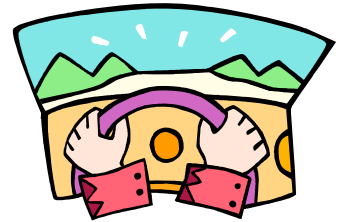
Culver City Senior Center Guest Speaker:
