- ≡ Founded on March 3, 1928, Culver CityBus is the second oldest municipally owned bus line in California.
- ≡ Operates seven routes serving over 5 million passengers annually with a service area encompassing 25.5 square miles, which includes the Westside communities of Venice, Westchester, Westwood, West Los Angeles, Palms, Marina del Rey, Mar Vista, Century City, and Culver City.
- ≡ Hours of operation: approximately 5:20 a.m. - 12:39 p.m. on weekdays; 5:40 a.m. - 11:56 p.m. on weekends.
- ≡ First transit agency in Los Angeles County to accept the Transit Access Pass (TAP) fare debit card.
- ≡ Accepts the EZ transit pass, which is a monthly pass that permits unlimited travel on 24 Los Angeles County transit systems without the use of transfers.
- ≡ Participates in the BruinGo! Program that provides discounted rides to UCLA students, faculty and staff.

- ≡ Provides maintenance, repair and replacement services for all City vehicles and equipment including, transit, emergency response, law enforcement and refuse vehicles.
- ≡ Responsible for the operation and maintenance of City fueling sites; ensures compliance with city, county, state and federal regulations governing the City's underground storage tanks (USTs) and their components.
- ≡ Administers The Equipment Replacement Fund (ERF) for all City equipment and acquisitions.
- ≡ Ensures compliance with environmental legislation and congestion management/air quality programs, including rideshare.
- ≡ Maintains City fleet of 102 alternative vehicles, including 52 Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) buses, 17 heavy-duty refuse trucks, and various other light, medium and heavy-duty vehicles.
- ≡ First public transit fleet in South Coast Air Quality Management District (AQMD) and the second in the State of California to operate a 100% CNG fleet.
- ≡ Awards and Recognition:
 - Recognized as the Nation's Safest Public Transit System by APTA (2002)
 - Ranked 7th in the Nation among 100 Best Fleets in North America (2005, 2006, 2010)
 - Named one of North America's 100 Best Fleets every year since 2006
 - Ranked 5th in the Nation among 100 Best Fleets in North America (2009)
 - Certified Green Model Shop by State of California
 - NGV Achievement Award Winner – Best Green Fleet in North America (2009)
