

**VETERANS' MEMORIAL BUILDING
CHAMPAGNE TOAST RULES & REGULATIONS**

You have chosen to include a champagne toast as a part of your event in the VMB. The sale and consumption of all alcoholic beverages, including champagne, are under the jurisdiction of the California Alcohol and Beverage Control Board.

The following rules and regulations must be adhered to from the time you or your guests enter the building until you and your guests have departed at the end of your event.

- Champagne is the only alcoholic beverage you may bring onto facility premises. You may only bring in one bottle of champagne for every 6 guests over the age of 21 expected to attend.
- Champagne must be served by a responsible person over the age of 21.
- All bottles, open or not, must be stored in an area that is not readily accessible to your guests (i.e. behind a bar or table). Bottles may not be placed on tables, and you may not allow guests to serve themselves.
- No champagne is to be served to any person under the age of 21. Building Management and/or Security may at any time require any guest to show valid proof-of-age.
- Champagne may be consumed only in the room you have rented. No glasses, bottles or open containers may be carried outside of the room by your guests.
- You may not sell champagne or other alcoholic beverages without a valid license from the Alcohol & Beverage Control Board.
- Underage drinkers or persons passing champagne to underage guests will be ejected from the building and/or turned over to police authorities.
- No champagne may be served to an already intoxicated individual. Typical signs of intoxication include staggering, slurred speech, bloodshot eyes, difficulty focusing on objects and thoughts and aggravated or excitable behavior.
- Your guests will not be permitted to bring alcoholic beverages into the Veterans' Memorial Building. Any guest attempting to do so will be denied entrance.
- No alcoholic beverage may be served to any facility staff, including but not limited to Management, Security Guards, and Maintenance Workers.

If any of the above conditions are violated, your event will be shut down immediately and the Culver City Police Department will be contacted.

WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY

I AGREE TO HOLD HARMLESS, RELEASE AND FOREVER DISCHARGE the City of Culver City, its respective elected and appointed boards and commissions, its officers, agents, and employees from any and all claims and demands whatsoever, which the undersigned, or any third person, or any person acting under my or their behalf, have or may have against the City of Culver City, or its respective elected and appointed boards and commissions, its officers, agents, and employees by reason of any accident, bodily injury or death arising or occurring from or during my use of the Veterans Memorial Building.

I UNDERSTAND THAT BY SIGNING THIS RELEASE I AM FOREVER GIVING UP ALL RIGHTS TO SUE THE CITY OF CULVER CITY OR ITS ELECTED OR APPOINTED BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS, ITS OFFICERS, AGENTS OR EMPLOYEES, OR TO RECOVER ANY MONEY OR DAMAGES FROM THEM FOR ANY HARM I OR MY GUESTS MAY SUFFER, INCLUDING BODILY INJURY OR DEATH, OCCURRING FROM OR DURING MY USE OF THE VETERANS' MEMORIAL BUILDING.
