

**NOTICE OF CULVER CITY CITY COUNCIL PUBLIC HEARING

THE 2004 NATURAL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN**

YOU ARE INVITED to learn more about and participate in the **September 13, 2004**, City Council public hearing concerning the City's adoption of a Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan (NHMP).

The Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 (Public Law 106-390) states that for a community to receive pre-disaster and post-disaster mitigation funds and also Federal Emergency Management Funds, a Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan must be submitted to the State, as well as to Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). Failure to submit an adequate plan by 2004 will disqualify a community from receiving disaster assistance until November 2005. The draft NHMP will be available for review from August 30, 2004 on the City's Emergency Plan webpage <http://www.culvercity.org/emergency.asp>, at City Hall Planning Division counter, and at the Culver City Julian Dixon Library.

The **September 13, 2004**, meeting will convene at 7:00 P.M., in the Mike Balkman Council Chambers at City Hall, 9770 Culver Boulevard. The Council Chambers are accessible to disabled persons and public parking is available in the City Hall parking structure from Duquesne Avenue. City Hall is served by the Culver CityBus. If more information regarding the bus schedule is needed, you may call (310) 253-6500. Other items may precede this item on the agenda.
