

1 **RESOLUTION NO. 2021-R 031**

3 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
4 CULVER CITY, CALIFORNIA, SUPPORTING THE GOAL OF
5 REACHING 100% ZERO EMISSION VEHICLE SALES IN
6 CALIFORNIA BY 2030.

7 WHEREAS, the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC)¹ is an
8 intergovernmental body of the United Nations created to assess the science related to
9 climate change and provide governments at all levels with scientific information they can
10 use to develop climate policies; and

11 WHEREAS, the IPPC advises that we have until 2030 to transform our
12 economy and the way we live to avoid the most catastrophic and irreversible effects of the
13 climate crisis; and

14 WHEREAS, the transportation sector is the largest contributor of greenhouse
15 gas emissions in California, contributing 40% of those emissions; and

16 WHEREAS, electrifying transportation needs to be a forefront of discussion
17 and innovation in an attempt to combat the climate crisis; and,

18 WHEREAS, California increased the number of zero emission vehicles in the
19 state by more than 3,000% in eight years, growing from 25,000 in 2012 to 763,816 in 2020,
20 with each year sales continuing to grow; and,

21 WHEREAS, all new vehicles sold in California by the year 2030 need to be
22 zero emission vehicles to decarbonize California's most polluting sector; and,

1 WHEREAS, zero emission vehicle technology continues to progress, making
2 a transition to a 100% electric transportation system both feasible and achievable; and

3 WHEREAS, major investments of time, thought and resources are needed at
4 the State and Federal levels to help create a zero emission vehicle transition that is
5 equitable and just, and to ensure that people of all backgrounds and income levels have
6 access to next-generation vehicles and required electrical infrastructure; and

7 WHEREAS, zero emission vehicles and services are an important and
8 growing sector of California's economy, an opportunity for quality jobs and tax revenue that
9 puts part of the federal government's Green New Deal congressional resolution in practice
10 in our state; and,

11 WHEREAS, the ZEV2030 Zero Emission Vehicle Pledge, available at
12 <https://www.zev030.org>, articulates the dire need for reform to California's transportation
13 system and its commitment to decarbonizing and combating the climate crisis.

14 NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Culver City DOES
15 HEREBY RESOLVE as follows:

- 16 1. The City Council of the City of Culver City does hereby officially
17 support the goal of 100% zero emission vehicle sales in California by 2030.




