

CULVER CITY HOMELESS PROGRAMMING FACT SHEET

On July 9, 2018, the Culver City council and Housing Authority Board jointly approved the Updated Plan to Prevent and Combat Homelessness—a multi-year plan to address homelessness, populations at risk of homelessness, and housing preservation and production.

Detailed below is general information on the City's homeless population and how the City is working with different partnerships to address the issue.



PARTNERSHIPS

The **Culver City Committee on Homelessness** was established on April 22, 2008. The committee consists of seven members who are residents and representatives from the Culver City business and service community. This body advises City Council and Housing Staff in identifying short and long term strategies to decrease homelessness in the Culver City community.

The Culver City contracts with **St. Joseph Center** to provide Homeless Outreach homeless outreach to individuals in our community and connect them to housing, medical care, and supportive services.

Culver City contracts with **Upward Bound House Family Shelter** serves to provide homeless children and their families with short-term shelter. Upward Bound House also works with the Culver City School District and links homeless children in City Schools to housing and supportive services.
