

The VA Greater Los Angeles Healthcare System (VAGLAHS) is one of the largest health care facilities within the Department of Veterans Affairs. VAGLAHS consists of two ambulatory care centers, a tertiary care facility and 10 community based outpatient clinics.

Bldg. 402, West of VA Hospital Provides homeless Veterans with same-day access to housing, primary care, mental health, and substance use treatment delivered by transdisciplinary care teams and Enhanced Housing First teams. In addition, staff from programs such as Department of Housing and Urban Development-VA Supportive Housing (HUD-VASH), Grant Per Diem, Homeless Veteran Supportive Employment Program, Outreach, and Community Residential Care offers services to homeless Veterans in the building. The program has dedicated space for representatives from Veterans Benefits Administration, social Security Administration, Los Angeles County Department of Mental Health, Pro Bono Legal Services through a Medical Legal Partnership, and the Supportive Services for Veteran Families program.

Offers a state-of-the-art ambulatory care facility. Extended care activities include a 120 bed Academic Nursing Home and a Primary Care Homebase Care Program. The center has specialty outpatient programs in spinal cord injury, stroke rehabilitation, women's health, preventative medicine, dentistry, mental health, and chemical dependency. Innovated programs that emphasize preventative care such as the Center For Ambulatory Rehabilitation and Education and the Day Hospital Program offer intensive treatment in an outpatient setting. The facility hosts extensive clinical and basic science research, including Geriatric Research Education and Clinical Center (GRECC) and Field Program for Health Science Research and Development (HSR&D). The HSR&D program evaluates provider practice and patient outcome studies in the delivery of ambulatory health care.

Consists of three ambulatory care centers, a tertiary care facility and 10 community-based outpatient clinics. Inpatient care is available in medicine, neurology, psychiatry, rehabilitation medicine, and surgery. Additional inpatient units include nursing home care and domiciliary.
